





The Altar Rail

When addressing the sanctuary, the General Instruction of the Roman Missal is silent concerning an altar rail, stating: "The sanctuary is the place where the altar stands, the Word of God is proclaimed, and the Priest, the Deacon, and the other ministers exercise their functions. It should be appropriately marked off from the body of the church either by its being somewhat elevated or by a particular structure and ornamentation. It should, moreover, be large enough to allow the Eucharist to be easily celebrated and seen. (295)

"The challenge to those responsible for its design is to convey the unique quality of the actions that take place in this area while at the same time expressing the organic relationship between those actions and the prayer and actions of the entire liturgical assembly. The sanctuary must be spacious enough to accommodate the full celebration of the various rituals of word and Eucharist with their accompanying movement, as well as those of the other sacraments celebrated there." (Living Stones 54)

Where they exist, the Holy See has expressed that altar rails should be seen considering the historical value of the entire sanctuary/church or even their artistic merit. In places where crowds might gather for touristic visits or simply high volume an altar rail can deter visitors from wandering.
