Some believe that if you bury a statue of St. Joseph, you will sell your house.

I found out that if you want to rent your house, just ask a "Sister of St. Joseph."

Our parish owns the house across the street from the rectory. Rented by our former organist, Rudy, and his family, the house became available as a rental at the end of the summer. It was then that I saw Sister Rosina praying in church.

Sister Rosina is a member of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Saint-Marc, a religious community of women that has its origins in France and whose charism is Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. She and her fellow 3

Sisters, all of whom are from India, are trained nurses. In this capacity they minister with the Carmelite Sisters to care for the aged at Ozanam Hall.

When we spoke in church that day Sister Rosina shared with me the community's need for more housing. Presently, she and her 3 sisters live in a modest house close to Ozanam. Informed by their provincial that 3 additional Sisters are on their way to assist them, the issue of housing became a concern. The present house cannot accommodate the soon-to-be arrivals. I told Sr. Rosina: "I believe St. Joseph has answered your prayers. We have a house available, and it has 3 bedrooms!"

I am happy to share that St, Mel's will not only have the fortune of 3 priests, but in early January the added blessing of 3 Religious Sisters! Once the Sisters are comfortably moved-in, I will formerly introduce them to the parish.

What a grace for our parish in this time of Eucharistic Revival to have the membership of these consecrated women whose main mission is to encourage Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

Come, let us adore Him!







## **Church Bells**

Church bell ringing dates to the 400s and the bishop St. Paulinus of Nola (today Southern Italy).

The US bishops express succinctly: "It is an ancient practice to summon the Christian people to the liturgical assembly or to alert them to important happenings in the local community by means of bells. The peal of bells is an expression of the sentiments of the People of God as they rejoice or grieve, offer thanks or petition, gather together and show outwardly the mystery of their oneness in Christ." (Living Stones 99)

Many churches also ring their bells thrice daily at 6AM [or 8AM], noon and 6PM summoning the faithful to recall the Incarnation by praying the Angelus thus "sanctifying" the entire day. This call is usually rung by a series of bells - three sets of three bells which correspond to the invocation, response and "Hail Mary" of the Angelus.

Before the proliferation of modern timekeeping methods bells also had an extremely practical use for the community being rung on the hour or even on the half or quarter hour in some places.

Church bells do not ring after the "Gloria" at the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday until the beginning of the "Gloria" of the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday.
