Another oasis, not especially known for quiet but for excellence, is even closer...St. Mel's Catholic Academy!


Today begins Catholic Schools Week: January 28th – February 3rd.

Mondays – 7:30 PM (Beginners) Thursdays – 8:00 PM



Religious Education Program



Liturgical Colors - Violet

EGERIA INSERTS

(Purple), Rose and Black

"The color violet or purple is used in Advent and Lent. It may also be worn in Offices and Masses for the Dead." (GIRM 346,d) Violet symbolizes penance, preparation and mourning. The color violet is used during the liturgical seasons of Advent and Lent as a sign of penance, sacrifice and preparation. "The color rose [a blending of violet and white] may be used, where it is the practice, on Gaudete Sunday (Third Sunday of Advent) and on Laetare Sunday (Fourth Sunday of Lent) (GIRM 346f) as a sign of the joy marking the midpoint in our preparation for, and anticipation of, the coming Christmas or Easter festivities.

In the United States violet vestments may worn on January 22, the Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children, when the Mass for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children is celebrated.

"Besides the color violet, the colors white or black may be used at funeral services and at other Offices and Masses for the Dead [most notably the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed on All Souls' Day, November 2] in the Dioceses of the United States of America." (GIRM 346e)

Outside of Mass, violet is also used during the hearing of confessions at the Sacrament of Penance.
