

St. Mel's Office of Faith Formation oversees the St. Mel School of Religion Program which provides Religious Instruction to children in grades 1 through 8 who attend public schools.

Through our Religious Education program, we seek to increase children's awareness of the presence of God in their daily lives through Scripture, prayer and an age-appropriate curriculum. The program also prepares the children to complete their initiation into the Catholic Church through the Sacraments of Penance/First Communion and Confirmation.

Classes are held on Wednesdays from 3:30 pm to 5:00 pm for Grades 1-5 and from 6:30 pm to 8:00 pm for Grades 6-8.

If you haven't already, new and returning students should register for the 2024-2025 school year as soon as possible by completing the on-line registration form at:

https://stmels-queens.org/religious-education. The tuition fee for the 2024-2025 school year is \$150 for one child, \$200 for two children and \$225 for three or more children. Tuition can be paid through one of the following three options:

Liturgical Postures: Kneeling

- Breast Striking - Prostration

Besides being an expression of adoration, kneeling was originally and still is a sign of penance. If fact, at times in Church history, particularly in religious communities, publicly kneeling for a period of time was a common penance given during the sacrament of Reconciliation. Today we might kneel together during a reconciliation service before or after individual confessions.

EGERIA INSERTS

Striking one's breast is another gesture that signifies sorrow, remorse, and penitence. While its meaning has long disappeared from our wider culture, we are still instructed to strike our breast during the Penitential Rite at the beginning of Mass, if the "I confess" (Confiteor) prayer is recited together as an act of sorrow.

Prostration is the act of lying on the floor before another, implying unworthiness as a result of sin. Today, those receiving Holy Orders prostrate themselves during the Litany of the Saints at ordinations, and many religious orders include prostration in their various welcoming rites. At the liturgy of Good Friday of the Lord's Passion, the priest and deacon prostrate themselves before the altar after the silent entrance procession, while the congregation is asked to kneel in silent prayer.
