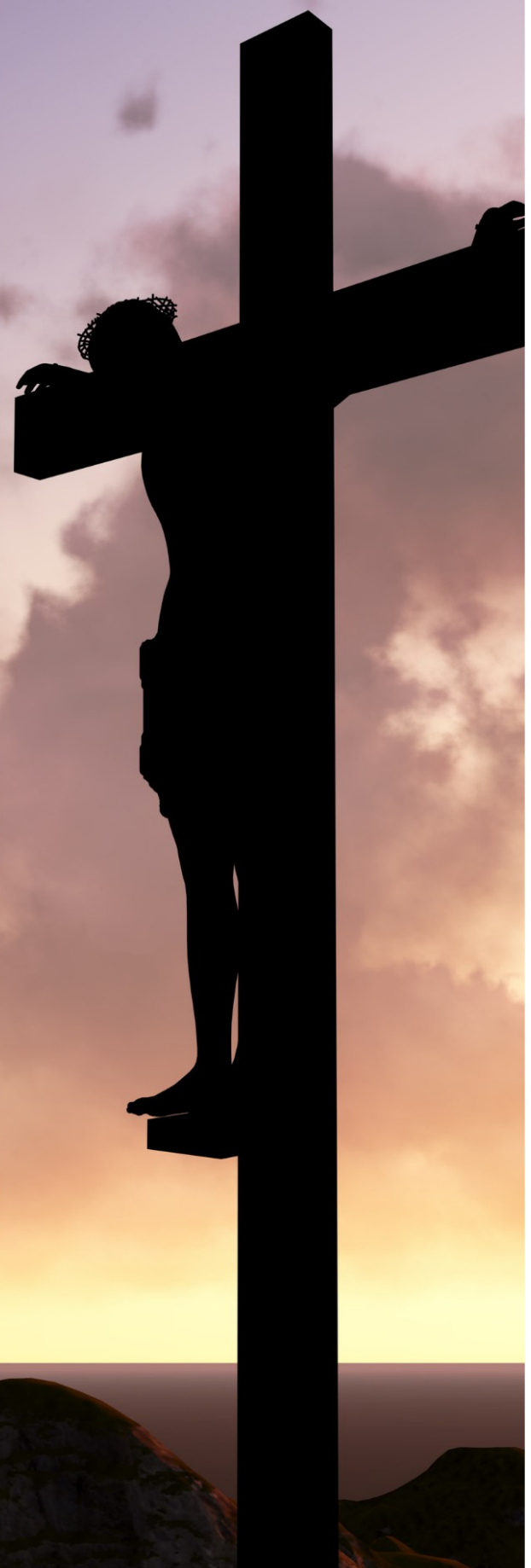

Today we begin the holiest week of the Church year.

With palms raised high, we make a pledge to stay close to Christ as we recall in these sacred days His betrayal, suffering, death, and Resurrection.

There are moments in life when we deliberately choose to stay close to someone we love—listening carefully, watching attentively, not wanting to miss an opportunity to support them. Holy Week invites us into that kind of closeness with Jesus: not from a distance, but with intention; not as observers, but as active participants in His saving work.

And so, in this holiest of weeks, the Church beckons us to follow Jesus along this sacred path:

- **Palm Sunday** – His joyful entrance into Jerusalem
- **Monday** – His anointing at Bethany by Mary
- **Tuesday** – His sobering words announcing Peter’s denial
- **Spy Wednesday** – His betrayal by Judas
- **Holy Thursday** – His gift of the Eucharist
- **Good Friday** – His carrying of the Cross
- **Holy Saturday** – His stillness in the tomb

Easter Sunday – His triumphant Resurrection

In these days, we are not merely remembering events of the past—we are invited to enter them: to stand at the table, to kneel at the Cross, to wait in the silence, and finally, to rejoice at the empty tomb.

May we take these days seriously. May we walk them prayerfully. And may we arrive, with Christ, at the joy of new life.

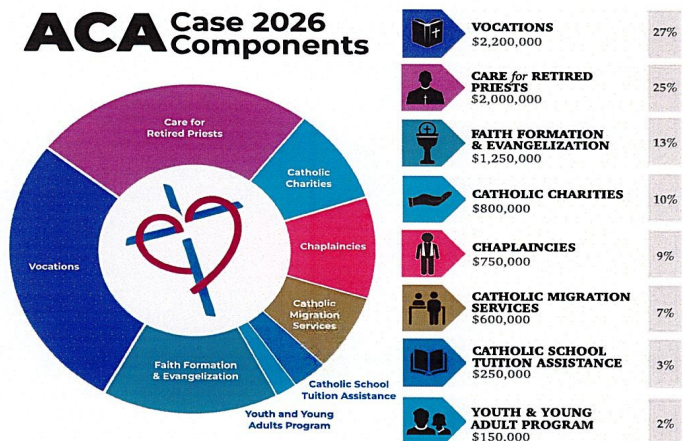

Congratulations to our Confirmandi! May the Holy Spirit fill you with courage, wisdom, and faith as you continue to grow in your relationship with God.



Two of our recently confirmed 8th graders gave witness talks at last Sunday's 10 AM Mass. Their words were powerfully inspiring! I'm moved to share these beautiful faith reflections with the entire parish.

Keo Ma St. Mel's Catholic Academy

I was not born with a predetermined belief in Christianity, instead, I made the choice to follow Christianity. My journey as a Christian began when my parents invested in Catholic education for me here at St. Mel's when I was three years old. Not only did I receive a quality education in a safe environment, I came to know and learn about Jesus' love through my teachers and pastor (if anyone remembers Father Lee). I recalled my parents bringing me and my sister to St. Mel's Church for the first time on a Sunday during the covid, we were sitting in the back close to the doors of the sacristy, and I asked my mother "Can we go down and sit in the middle so I can see the altar?" Even at a young age, something about Christianity drew me in, and I found myself wanting to be part of it in a deeper way. When I was six years old, I approached my pastor, Father Fonti, and asked to be baptized. He agreed, but only if my parents gave their consent. When I asked them, they supported my decision to become a Christian Catholic. That same year, I received Penance and Communion, marking a transformative year in my spiritual life. Experiencing these sacraments helped me understand that faith is not just something I believe in, yet something I live out through my actions and choices. Receiving Communion for the first time made me feel connected to the Church in a deeper way, and Penance taught me the importance of reflection, forgiveness, and starting again. Looking back, I realize that these moments helped lay the foundation for the faith I continue to grow in today.

Here I am, at St Mel's Church, which I call it my home away from home. I am grateful for my parents, my teachers, my pastor now Father Fonti, whom all teach me and equip me with a precious gift, an indispensable tool that I will carry on with me, that is, the Catholic faith. I want to receive the sacrament of Confirmation because I want to strengthen my personal relationship with Jesus and deepen my commitment to the Church. I want to follow the guide of the Holy Spirit through high school and beyond as I grow older and take on greater responsibility. I see Confirmation as choosing my faith again, with a deeper understanding and maturity than I was six years ago.

In preparation for the reception of Sacrament of Confirmation, I have continued to pray, dedicate time to learn more about my faith, and devote myself to services to others. Particularly, being an altar server helps enhance my understanding and connection to the liturgy. One of the most memorable moments was on Christmas Eve during the Midnight Mass. Being in church at a time when I was supposed to be sound asleep felt surreal; the peace and quiet, the candles, and the soft hymns made the celebration feel sacred. Moments like this serve as a reminder to me why altar serving is a crucial part of my spiritual life.

Right now as I finished preparing for Confirmation, I felt that my relationship with Christ is becoming stronger and more personal. One remarkable difference I notice is that I've grown more comfortable conversing with God. I'm aware that I am still growing - I'm not perfect in my faith - but I feel closer to God now than I did before. As I have mentioned, my parents were not baptized to be Roman Catholic but they have supported me and my sister to practice my faith as a Christian. Numerous times my parents have shared with me their interest in joining the program for the Rites of Christian Initiation. I hope that as I continue to live out my faith daily, I can influence my parents and encourage them to soon take the step.

One year from now, I hope to weave faith into every part of my life, not just on Sundays. I want to build habits, such as going to Confession more regularly and reading Scripture daily, that stay with me. For years to come. I plan to continue serving at mass, whether in St. Mel's or in my high school, and to remain active in my parish community. Above all, I pray to become more aware of the Holy Spirit's guidance and more confident in prayer as I grow in my spiritual life. I hope that through Confirmation, I can continue becoming the person God calls me to be.

There are many reasons I want to receive the sacrament of Confirmation, but the main reason is that at this point, I can't imagine life without God. I know this may come as a surprise to my teachers over the years, as well as to Father Fonti, because sometimes I talk too much to my friends and I don't always listen in class - but I have listened at least 95% of the time. And, to tell you the truth, God has spoken loud and clear 100% of the time. I know this because I truly feel I take God with me every where I go, and no one asks me to do it. I try to be kind, caring, and a good person. I bless myself and pray before I eat every meal. I wear a Cross, and am proud to. In addition, I was accepted into three Catholic high schools for the Fall, and I plan to attend one of them. This is because I want both religion and God to be part of each and every day. I want Him to guide me in school and in sports. While I don't judge others or their beliefs, in my opinion, a world without God and faith is a very sad world. Also, I'm getting older and more mature, so I think it's time to receive the Holy Spirit and actively serve God and others, as opposed to just take Religion classes. I feel this will deepen my bond with God, which is already pretty strong. This is why I want to receive the sacrament of Confirmation.

To prepare for Confirmation, I have taken eight years of Religion classes, attended Church, and lived a life of faith, kindness, and compassion. I was also happy to complete service hours as one of our projects. Confirmation is a very special Sacrament because we take the commitment we made at Baptism to serve Christ, the Church, and others, and go out into the world and live it.

The older I get, the more I trust my ability to listen carefully to the Holy Spirit and trust the Holy Spirit in my life. I intend to continue to live my life as a Roman Catholic by leading with God in my actions, and by remembering to pray to Him at the times it is hardest to have faith and believe. These are some of my biggest spiritual goals. Last year, one of my uncles passed away. He was sick and died way too young. Uncle Jimmy was my Godfather, which means he was here at the sacrament of Baptism. He was one of my best buds and biggest supporters. To go through that at 12 years old was very tough. I got through it not only with the support of my family, but with the help of God as well. This weekend, I am blessed to have one of my other uncles as my sponsor, my Uncle Joe. I love and admire my Uncle Joe very much, and he is very important to me. And, I am proud to say that even though he passed away last year, my Uncle Jimmy is actually here with all of us today, too. I am wearing a chain that represents him. In addition, my Confirmation name is James, after my Uncle Jimmy. I can think of no greater honor. This might be the biggest reason of all that I want to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, and why I feel I am ready for it.



HOW TO PRAY THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Make the Sign of the Cross and then announce the each station, and say:

*† We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you. (Genuflect)
‡ Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.*



First Station: Jesus is condemned to death.

*† We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you. (Genuflect)
‡ Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.*
After having been scourged and crowned with thorns, we reflect on how Jesus was unjustly condemned by Pilate.

After each reflection:

Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be to the Father

*At the Cross her station keeping,
Stood the mournful Mother weeping,
Close to Jesus to the last.*



Second Station: Jesus carries his cross.

Take a moment to imagine the weight of that cross on Jesus' shoulders and how he thought of us, and what He was about to offer for our sake.

Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be to the Father

*O how sad and sore distressed
Was that Mother highly blest,
Of the sole-begotten One!*



Third Station: Jesus falls the first time.

Pause here to reflect on how Jesus stumbled under the weight of the cross. He was so weakened, battered, and bloody yet he persevered.

Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be to the Father

*Christ above in torment hangs,
She beneath beholds the pangs
Of her dying glorious Son.*



Fourth Station: Jesus meets his mother, Mary.

Contemplate the sorrow of Mary as she meets her son on the road to Calvary. Ask Mary to accompany us in our sorrows and challenges.

Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be to the Father

*Is there one who would not weep,
Whelmed in miseries so deep,
Christ's dear Mother to behold?*



Fifth Station: Simon helps Jesus carry the cross.

Reflect on how Simon of Cyrene stepped in to help Jesus. Let's pray for the grace to help others in their times of need. Lord, teach us to be like Simon, willing to lend a helping hand.

Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be to the Father

*Can the human heart refrain
From partaking in her pain,
In that Mother's pain untold?*



Sixth Station: Veronica wipes the face of Jesus.

Imagine Veronica's act of kindness and courage. Pray for the courage to show mercy to others. Lord, help us see your face in those who suffer.

Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be to the Father

*Bruised, derided, cursed, defiled
She beheld her tender Child
All with bloody scourges rent.*



Seventh Station: Jesus falls the second time.

Pause to reflect on Jesus' second fall. Pray for the strength to persevere in our own trials, Jesus, strengthen us in our weakness.

Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be to the Father

*For the sins of His own nation,
Saw Him hang in desolation
Till His spirit forth He sent.*

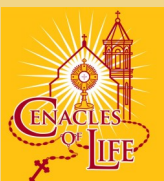

Observing and Celebrating Holy Week

Holy Week should be observed like no other week, at church, home, school, work, or play. There should be a mindfulness and solemnity fitting the importance of the mystery we celebrate: the passion, death, and resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

Prior preparation is required, as Holy Week is unique in the Church and parish calendar. Even the days and times that the church is open or closed will be different, so get current bulletin or contact the parish office or website. Many parishes have additional prayer opportunities. Morning prayer, penance opportunities, processions (with special starting points) may all be scheduled in addition to the liturgies of the Holy Paschal Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil on Saturday night, and Easter Sunday). The celebrations of Holy Week are better appreciated when you read the Scriptures to be proclaimed beforehand. The US Bishops' website has the daily reading throughout the year: <https://bible.usccb.org>.

Organizing schedules for families is always a challenge. Plan to go to church together. In some cultures, it is common to visit cemeteries during Holy Week or plan family dinners/gatherings for Passion/Palm Sunday or Easter Sunday.

Around the house, try not to do too much unnecessary work. Perhaps a reserved spot for simple decoration crafted by the family together could be a reminder for everyone of the solemnity of these days. Mindful that Good Friday is a day of fasting and abstaining from meat, besides an appropriate menu some in the family might need your prayerful encouragement.
